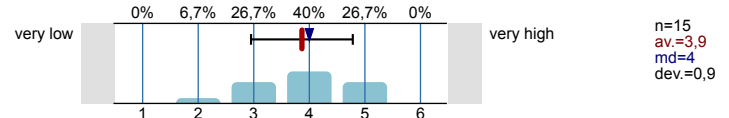

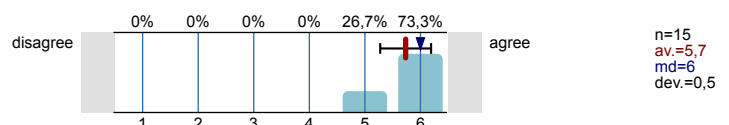

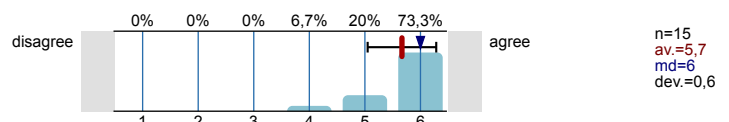

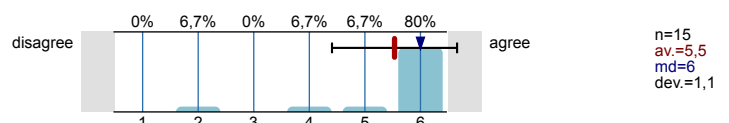

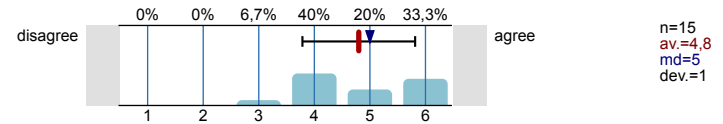

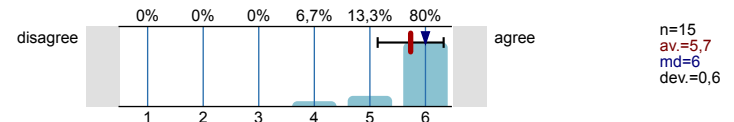

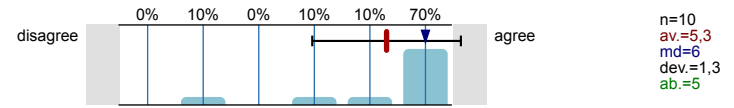

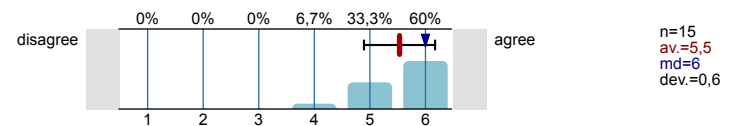

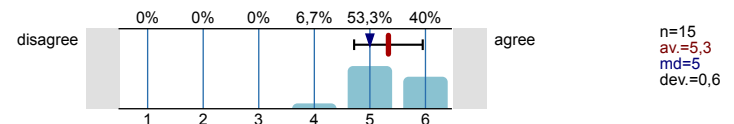

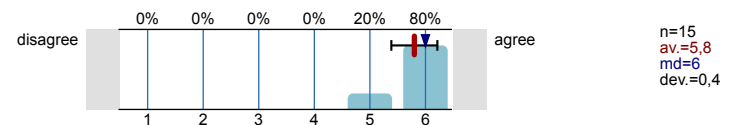

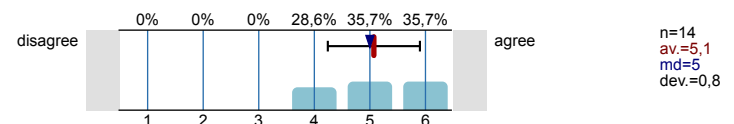

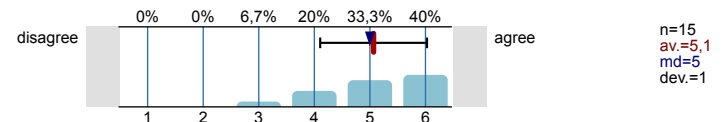

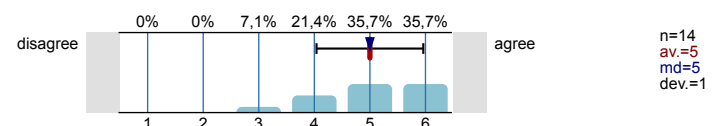

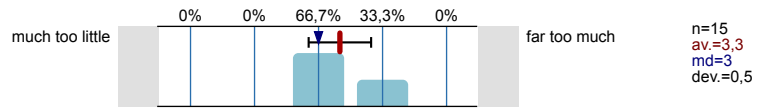

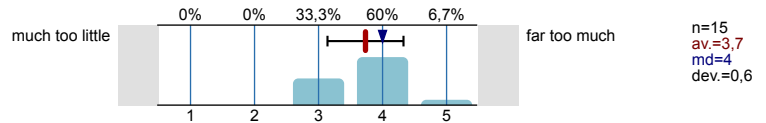

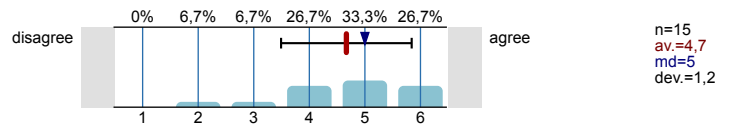


How do you find the scope of the reading material for the seminar?

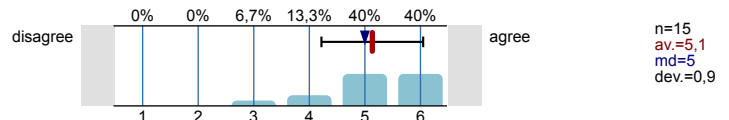

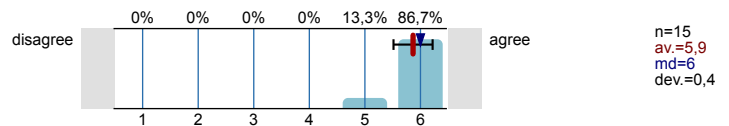

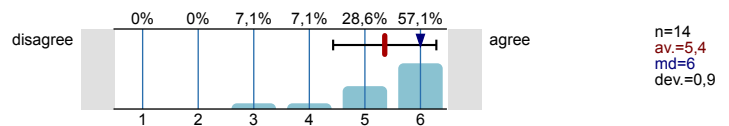

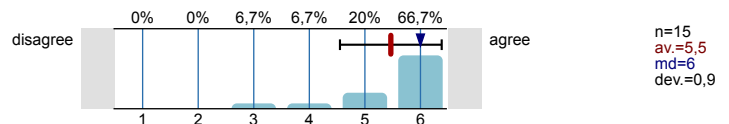

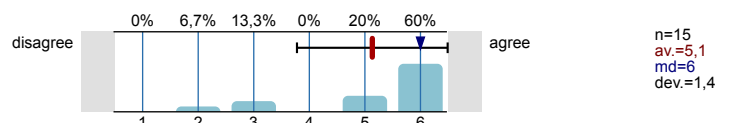

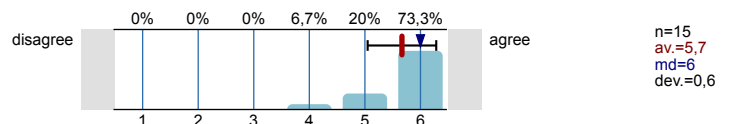

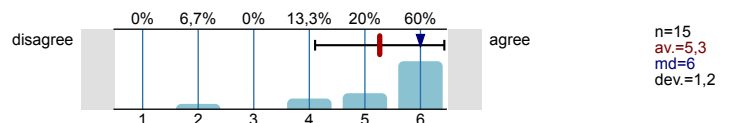

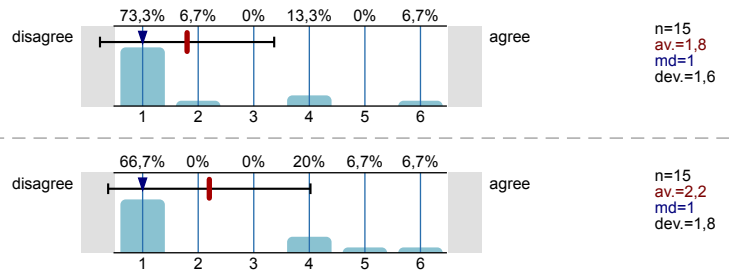

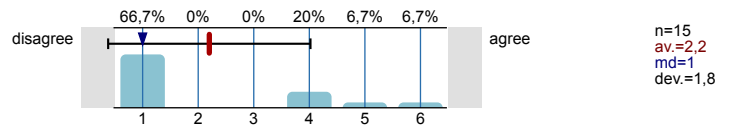

Are there time overlaps between this seminar and courses of the same module in this semester?

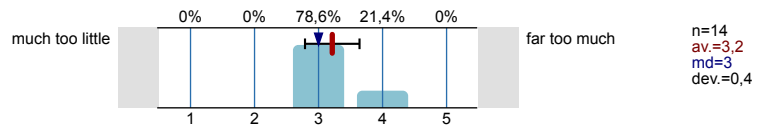


Are there time overlaps between this seminar and courses of others modules in this semester?

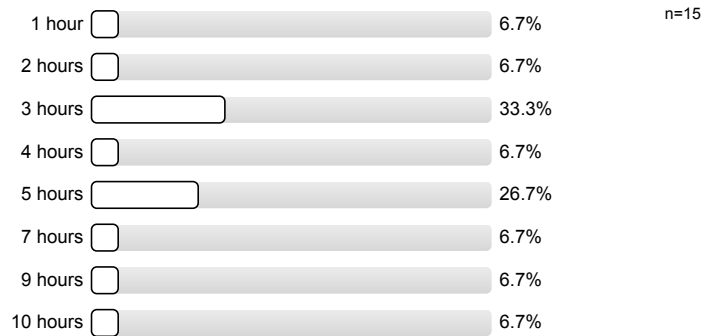

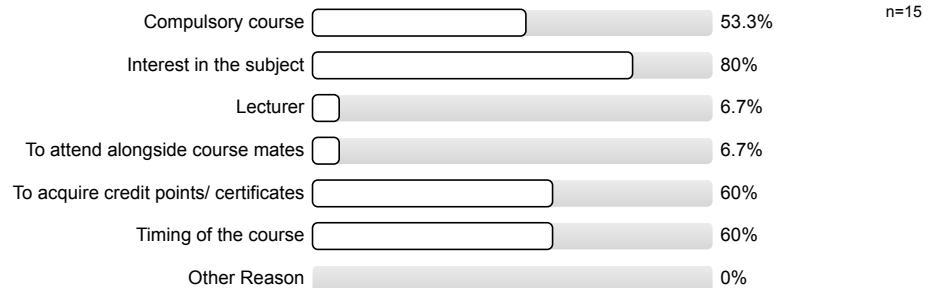

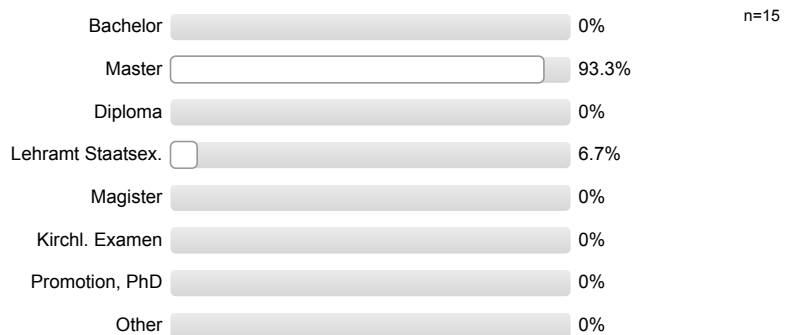

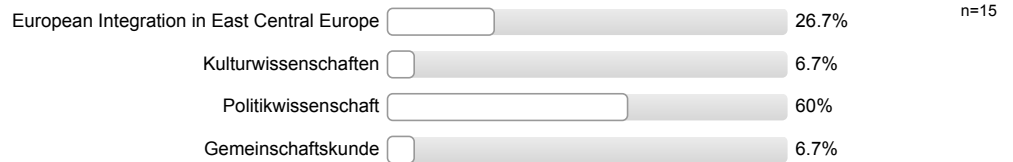

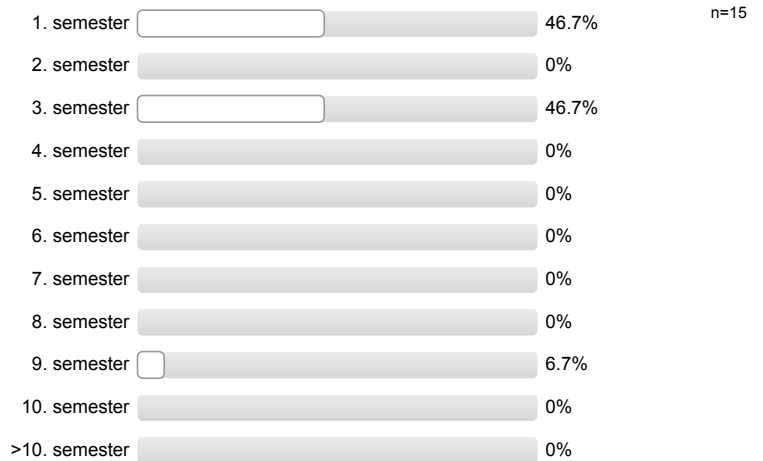

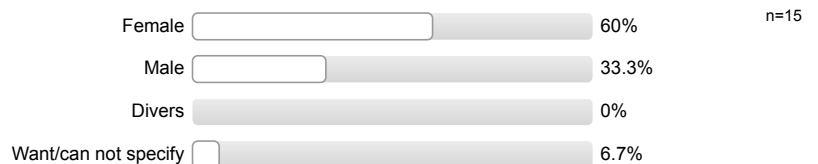

- would've been interesting to also include the case of Lybia since it seems more significant to me than some other cases that we covered (ex. Guinea)
- I enjoyed the Seminar, it was especially useful for me to catch up with the whole UN topic. I think some more secondary literature could have been nice to accompany the UN Reports. But working with the reports was obviously the concept of the Seminar, and i liked that too.
Sometimes the presentation and Ms Leibs input was a bit redundant and the presenations in general couldve gone a bit more into depth instead of covering the literature that every participant has read anyways.
- The UN Materials were at times a bit dry and exhaustive - it could have been interesting to get another perspective or use a non-UN source, even additionally, to contextualize what we've read in the primary sources.

The game at the end was fun and very insightful

- The repetitive structure of every session (two presentations + discussion of the UN report) had a disengaging effect on student participation.
- The teacher is highly competent regarding her knowledge and ways of teaching and was very friendly.

In my opinion though, student presentations slow down the seminars, make them less interesting, and occupy time for discussion. Also, the structure of the seminar was "schooly"; a more open and text focused approach is more interesting to me. The teacher is not responsible for this but I was personally not interested in the topic of conflict resolution while the module was mandatory. During our Master studies though, we're probably old enough to choose modules on our own instead of being forced to attend courses we're not interested in. Also, the new portfolio assignment seems counterproductive regarding the development of research skills. Again, not the teachers fault!
After this critique, I want to emphasize again, that she was very competent and friendly.
- The way these very complex topics were presented was really great, with a lot of caution to the language used. it felt very respectful and insightful. The group discussions also helped to get a better understanding of the issues presented.
